

ASSERT YOUR RIGHTS

Everyone living in the United States has certain basic rights under the U.S. constitution, regardless of their immigration status.

YOU HAVE CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS

In case you have an encounter with immigration agents:

-  1. **REMAIN CALM**, do not run.
-  2. **DO NOT OPEN THE DOOR**, without ICE showing a judicial warrant signed by a judge.
-  3. **DON'T ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS.** You have the right to remain silent.

4. GIVE THE RED CARD TO THE AGENT.

This card informs the agent that you are asserting your constitutional rights:

- The right to remain silent and not speak with the agent.
- The right to not let the agent into your house.
- The right to not allow the agent to search your house or belongings.

You have constitutional rights:

- **DO NOT OPEN THE DOOR** if an immigration agent is knocking. If you are inside of your house, show the card through the window or slide it under the door.
- **DO NOT ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS** from an immigration agent if they try to talk to you. You have the right to remain silent.
- **DO NOT SIGN ANYTHING** without first speaking to a lawyer. You have the right to speak with a lawyer.
- If you are outside of your house, **SHOW THIS CARD TO THE AGENT.** Ask the agent if you are free to leave and if they say you can, leave calmly.

IMPORTANT

- Keep red cards with you at all times.
- Make sure that all your family members have a red card.



REMEMBER !



DO NOT LIE. Never show false identification or documents.



YOU ARE NOT OBLIGATED to discuss your immigration status or citizenship with police, immigration agents, or other officials.



DO NOT SIGN ANYTHING. You have the right to speak with a lawyer.



DO NOT CONSENT TO A SEARCH of you or your belongings.



You can ask for an interpreter.



You have the right to ask for the name of the immigration agent and their identification number (ID).
